Andrew, Kendrick, and Josh are students at Francis Douglas Memorial College. Each week they host this live show, and talk about everything from current events, to school

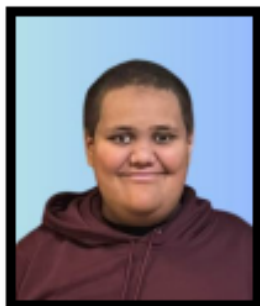


happenings, with great music and a sprinkling of lively teenage banter!
