Studio Etiquette 101



Our studios are busy little places. Most days they are used by multiple

different people, and it's really important that they are left the way you find them. Here's a few reminders on studio etiquette:-

- To adjust microphone positions, move the arm of the mic, not the mic itself.
- If you feel the need to laugh, snort, squeal, or make any other loud noise, please lean back from the mic.
- LIVE If you are working the desk you MUST be wearing headphones, and have volume turned up.
- LIVE Check the volumes constantly. The volume should be at a constant level - adjust mics and faders accordingly.
- LIVE Once you've saved your recording, close the file on Wavepad
- Leave headphones neatly on desk, or hanging up on hooks (live studio)
- Always fill out a Podcast Profile form before leaving the building. If there are no forms in the studio, ask us for more, or just use a piece of scrap paper
- Remove any rubbish, push chairs in, leave studio tidy
- LIVE Check that the Playlist Computer (Comp 1) is on AUTOMATE, and the fader is at the dark line.

If you need clarification on ANY of the above, please don't hesitate to ask us!

Promoting your show

This is something we mention often, because it is important. While ART does a certain amount of promotion for your show, ultimately YOU are the boss of this. Don't be shy to build your brand. Getting active on social media is free, and an easy way to share your podcasts. Other suggestions:-

- Have an email list of interested parties and send out the link to your podcasts as soon as they're up
- Write a blurb for your school, work, or social club newsletter
- Contact local media to do a story on your show
- How about having business cards, posters or stickers printed? (at your cost)

The possibilities are endless! We provide the platform, training, support and encouragement for over 30 local showmakers. It's up to you what you do with the end result!
